Funeral services for former Shidler resident Mrs. Laura Yelton, 81, have been set for 10 a.m. Friday in the Colonial Chapel to the Neckamp Funeral Home, Bartlesville. Burial, with Rev. 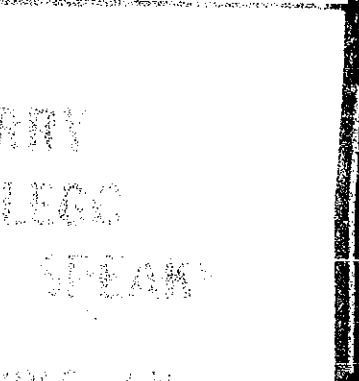

Rangetop Kitchen Summer Cook-Saver

Tomato Chicken Spaghetti

TOMATO CHICKEN
It's made on top of the range.
3-pound frying chicken, cut up
1 teaspoon salt
1/4 teaspoon pepper
1/4 teaspoon paprika
2 to 3 tablespoons olive oil
1 medium onion, cut in thin strips
15-ounce can tomato sauce
1 clove garlic, minced
1/2 teaspoon oregano
1/2 teaspoon sugar

Sprinkle the chicken with a mixture of the salt, pepper, and paprika. In a large skillet in the hot oil, brown the chicken; remove. In the drippings in the skillet gently cook the onion until golden; stir in the tomato sauce, garlic, oregano and sugar. Return chicken to skillet. Simmer, covered and turning as necessary, until tender — about 45 minutes. Skim off excess fat if you like. Makes 4 or 5 servings.
