Casper W. "Cap" Hoag III, 40, was operating a bulldozer and suffered a punctured artery after being struck by a tree limb, said Jack Carson, a spokesman for the Agriculture Department.

Wounded Knee Massacre Remembered at Ceremo

WOUNDED KNEE, S.D. (AP) -The Big Foot Memorial Ride ended Friday with a ceremony at the Wounded Knee memorial on the Pine Ridge Indian Reservation. It marked the 110th anniversary of the Wounded Knee massacre.

Those at the ceremony remembered Chief Big Foot and more than 250 mostly unarmed American Indians who died at the hands of the U.S. Army's 7th Cavalry on Dec.

Arvol Looking Horse, keeper of the Lakota sacred pipe, told the riders they suffered through the Dakota winter just like their ancestors 110 years ago.

"Let go of hatred, anger, jealousy. Bring back respect among the people. That's who we are," he said.


